On November 26<sup>th</sup> 2021 Emmanuel macron and Mario Draghi signed in Rome a landmark pact of friendship and cooperation: a sort of permanent enhanced cooperation between the two states. In the words of the French President, it “*will promote the convergence of French and Italian positions, as well as the coordination of the two countries in matters of European and foreign policy, security and defence, migration policy, economy, education, research, culture and cross-border cooperation*”.
